

## Letter of Reference of Local Mentor: Information

### What is the “European Palliative Care Academy”?

The European Palliative Care Academy is an initiative of the Robert Bosch Stiftung, a major German charitable foundation associated with a private company ([www.bosch-stiftung.de](http://www.bosch-stiftung.de)). It is a joint project of the four academic centres

- University Hospital Cologne/ Germany
- King’s College London/ United Kingdom
- Nicolaus Copernicus University in Torun/ Poland
- Hospice Casa Sperantei, Brasov/ Romania

Together, these institutions have developed a curriculum for emerging palliative care leaders of all professional backgrounds from across Europe.

Each academic institution offers one face-to-face teaching week, so that participants visit all four institutions throughout the course. The course language is English. In addition to the four teaching weeks, the participants complete one week of observation in a European palliative care institution of his or her choice. Together with continuous assignments and a personal project, the course comprises of approximately 690 hours and should be completed within 1.5 years. The course is to be completed part-time, enabling the participants to continue their work in palliative care.

The course is accredited with 27 ECTS on Master level.

The next course will start in September 2019. The course will be repeated every two years. For further information please see [www.eupca.eu](http://www.eupca.eu).
